# PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION

With the implementation of this initiative, students will have the opportunity to sign up for a 5-part program in which they with be divided into teams to participate in engaging, collaborative, team-building activities to earn points towards their overall team total! Students must submit their program application in August to be included in the program series. There will be a total of 8 teams, with an average number of 12 participates on each team. Each team will have a committee liaison to lead teams through group activities, keep attendance at programs, award points, etc. Individuals will work together through virtual activities to earn points towards their team's total score! At the end of the program series, there will be prizes for the top 3 teams!




## Program Series


- First program- In the first program, students will get to know their team! Students will complete icebreakers, share contact info, create team name, and chose their team color and mascot! (Virtual- Zoom)
